Frawley Memorial Endowed Scholarship fund to support the Student Merit Scholarship program. New Fellows Graduate Scholarship Fund

The 2013 AHIMA Fellowship Review Committee recently voted to establish the AHIMA Fellows Graduate Scholarship Fund as a way for Fellows, as the recognized leaders in HIM, to give back to the profession and set an example for other AHIMA members. Since a graduate degree is a requirement of fellowship eligibility, the committee voted to establish a scholarship to benefit students seeking advanced degrees.

The scholarship is slated for 2015. Eligibility criteria and requirements will be:

- Five years continuous membership in AHIMA at the time of application
- Two years of local, state, national, or international health information management volunteer activities
- Verified enrollment in a graduate program at an accredited university
- An essay explaining how the applicant's professional development and

EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Transforming the Health Information Workforce: Reality 2016

In early June, as part of the *Reality 2016* initiative, the Council for Excellence in Education (CEE) and the CEE Curricula Workgroup revised the curriculum maps for all three academic levels (associate, baccalaureate, and graduate). The results of their work, in the form of a side-by-side curriculum map and individual academic level detailed curriculum maps, were made available for both internal and external stakeholders. The work of these groups was informed by workforce hiring representatives who shared their vision of the changing needs in HIM to ensure the resulting curricula sufficiently prepares students for the future.

The draft revisions were made available for member, educator, and external stakeholder comment. The CEE Curriculum Workgroup is reviewing and responding to comments and aims to have a final draft by the end of 2013 for the Commission on Accreditation for Health Informatics and Information Management Education, which will establish an implementation timeline for accreditation purposes. National Guidelines for Apprenticeship Standards Certified

AHIMA's National Guidelines for Apprenticeship Standards were certified by the United States Department of Labor (DoL) during the <u>Healthcare Forward Summit</u> this summer in Washington, DC. The certification of the guidelines will help bridge the gap for graduating or post-certification students seeking a career in HIM through paid apprenticeships, where the AHIMA Foundation will serve as an intermediary, which will provide a clear pathway to full-time employment. Study: Hard Facts on Computer-Assisted Coding

A new AHIMA Foundation-supported study finds computer-assisted coding (CAC) can help code inpatient records more quickly and does not reduce accuracy when paired with a credentialed coder. The study is described in the July issue of the *Journal of AHIMA*. Foundation Study is Basis for HHS Report to Congress

This summer, the US Department of Health and Human Services delivered a study to Congress, "The Application of EHR Payment Incentives for Providers Not Receiving Other Payment Incentives." Prepared under contract between the HHS Office of Disability, Aging and Long-Term Care Policy and AHIMA Foundation, the study found that the adoption of electronic health records (EHRs) for long-term, post acute care, and behavioral health providers is essential to improve coordinated care for the most vulnerable patients.
